The current library space for Toogoolawah residents is only 84m², which is insufficient to meet community needs.

There's no room for expansion or visiting services, forcing residents to travel to Esk or Kilcoy. The lack of adequate meeting and workshop spaces hinders community cohesion.

Available spaces are often large halls lacking proper infrastructure such as air conditioning, heating, disability access, or amenities. The new facility, centrally located on Cressbrook Street, will attract visitors with its back deck overlooking the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail.

Positioned next to the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail, it will provide ample parking and bicycle facilities, serving as a gateway for visitors to Toogoolawah and the rail trail.

BENEFITS TO THE REGION

- Provides security for visiting services there will always be staff in the library while the services are in attendance.
- Provides an opportunity for the library and community services to utilise both spaces, increasing delivery capacity.
- Enhances the opportunities for library and community to partner on projects for the benefit of the residents.
